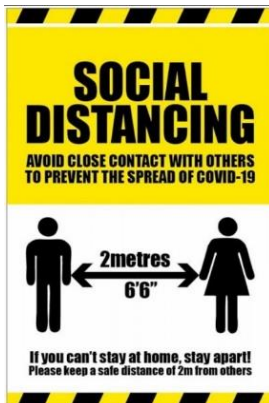

# STIRLING MOSS TROPHY SPRINT

## SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

### **1 ANNOUNCEMENT**

The Harrow Car Club Ltd. will organise and promote an Interclub permit Sprint on Sunday 6th September 2020. The event will be held at North Weald Airfield, near Harlow, Essex.

**Motorsport UK permit number 118187**

### **2 JURISDICTION**

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations.

### **3 ELIGIBILITY**

The event is a round of the following championships, and is open to Registered Entrants of the -

key.guru AEMC Sprint Championship (CH2020/S095)  
Hamilton Classics ACSMC Speed Championship (CH2020/S092)  
G.F & Co B19MC Speed Championship (CH2020/S056)  
Insite Graphics Sevenoaks & DMC Speed League (CH2020/S021)  
Insite Graphics Sevenoaks & DMC Speed League Pre 1980 (CH2020/S047)  
BTRDA Allrounders Championship

and fully elected members of the Harrow Car Club, Green Belt Motor Club, and all members of clubs affiliated to the ACSMC, ASEMC and AEMC regional associations.

### **4 TIMETABLE**

The programme for the event will be -

8.00 am Paddock opens (please do **NOT** arrive before this time)  
9:15 am Convoy runs if needed  
9.45 am Practice runs commence  
11.30 am First timed runs

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### **5 COURSE**

The length of the North Weald course is approximately 1800 metres. Markers will be used to define both left and right hand bends on tarmac and concrete surfaces.

### **6 CLASSES**

**Hybrid & Electric Cars are NOT permitted at this event.**

Cars may only be entered in their appropriate class. However the organisers reserve the right to adjust or amalgamate classes at their discretion in the interests of fair competition.

The event will consist of the following categories and classes –

**A. Road Going Series Production (S.12.1.1), Specialist Production (S.12.1.2), Standard Cars (S.11.1) –**

**Excluding cars in Appendix 1**

1. 'Standard Cars': Up to 1600cc – 2wd only, list 1A tyres
2. 'Standard Cars': Over 1600cc to 2000cc – 2wd only, list 1A tyres
3. Up to 1600cc - 2wd only, list 1A or 1B tyres
4. Over 1600cc to 2300cc – 2wd only, list 1A or 1B tyres
5. Over 2300cc - 2wd only, list 1A or 1B tyres
6. 4wd of all engine capacities - with list 1A or 1B tyres.

**Road Going Kit Type and Replica Cars (Examples are included in Appendix 1)**

7. Up to 1800cc - excluding Motorcycle engine cars. list 1A or 1B tyres
8. Over 1800cc - including all Motorcycle engine cars, list 1A or 1B tyres

**B. Modified Cars (Series Production (S.13.1), Specialist Production (S.13.2), Rally Cars conforming to R.46 to R.49 and Rallycross Cars & derivatives conforming to N.6**

**Excluding those listed in Appendix 1:**

9. Up to 1400cc
10. Over 1400cc to 2000cc
11. Over 2000cc

**Kit Type and Replica Cars (Examples are included in Appendix 1)**

12. Up to 2000cc
13. Over 2000cc - and all Motorcycle engine cars.

**C. Sports Libre Cars (S.14.1)**

14. Sports Libre Cars with 'Car' engines up to 1800cc and Motorcycle engine cars up to 1100cc.
15. Sports Libre Cars with 'Car' engines over 1800cc, Motorcycle engine cars over 1100cc.

**D. Racing Cars (S.15.1.1)**

16. Racing Cars up to 1,100cc and those Racing Cars conforming to 'Formula Ford' specifications.
17. Racing Cars over 1100cc

**Appendix 1:**

Two-seater cars such as Caterham, Westfield, Sylva, Fisher and Lotus 7, Elise, Exige and 340R, Vauxhall 220, X-bow- and similar types / derivatives.

**Note 1:** Engine capacity increase/decrease factors: a. Forced induction, an increase of 40%, except for 'Standard Cars' where an increase of 70% should be applied. Rotary engined cars, an increase of 50% on the real capacity.

**Note 2.**

To compete in a Single Seater Racing or Sports Libre Car, manufactured after 31/12/1960 of more than 2000cc, the driver must hold a RS National licence (H.17.1) unless the car is currently licensed for use on the public highway and competes in the event in a road legal condition.

**In the event of a dispute concerning the compliance of a vehicle to the regulations for the event the onus will be on the competitor to prove the compliance to the organisers. Road going cars must be taxed, insured and fully MOT tested (where necessary) and road legal in all respects.**

## 7. Signing on and Scrutineering

Due to the Covid 19 Virus you will be required to complete, sign and forward to the secretary of the meeting a **Motorsport UK Competitor Signing On Form**. This will be sent to you on receiving your entry. If this completed form is not received by email before the entry closing date you will **NOT** be able to compete.

This form includes a Technical Declaration for scrutineering including vehicle, safety equipment and PPE details. This information will be forwarded electronically to the event scrutineers for approval prior to the event.

Vehicle inspections will only be conducted if absolutely necessary (e.g. as a result of the declaration audit), and these should be visual inspections avoiding any contact with the competitor's vehicle or equipment. With checks selected and carried out to minimise contact with vehicle,

Road going cars must be taxed, insured and fully MOT tested (where necessary) and fully road legal in all respects. We will be checking these items using the DVLA website.

**LICENCES** – To compete in a Single Seat Racing or Sports Libre Car, manufactured after 31/12/1960 of more than 2000cc (or 1428cc if forced induction), the driver must hold a Speed National A [OPEN] or Race National A licence unless the car is currently licensed for use on the public highway, in accordance with S7.1.5. Sports Libre cars include Special Saloons and Sports Racing cars as in S14.1.

**ELIGIBILITY** – In the event of a dispute concerning the compliance of a vehicle to the regulations for the event the onus will be on the competitor to prove the compliance to the organisers.

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## 8. AWARDS

Awards are presented on the day and based on the fastest timed run as follows –

Best Time of the Day .....	* Trophy and Replica
Best Harrow CC Competitor .....	*Trophy and Replica
Best Green Belt MC Competitor .....	an award
1 <sup>st</sup> in Class .....	an award
2 <sup>nd</sup> in Class (subject to 5 starters).....	an award
3 <sup>rd</sup> in Class (subject to 8 starters) .....	an award
1 <sup>st</sup> Novice (subject to 4 starters) .....	an award
Best Time for a Lady Competitor .....	an award

A novice is defined as a person who has not won a class award or better at an Interclub, or higher grade speed event. All awards are perpetual except for named trophies (\*) and held for 11 months. No competitor may win more than one award. To qualify for an award, at least one timed run must be completed. Ties will be resolved by the fastest time on the first timed run. The number of runs will be determined on the day, the fastest run to count for the final results as S9.5.1.

## 9. ENTRIES

**The entry list opens on the publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes on Sunday 30 August 2020, allowing time for the pre event scrutineering.**

**Entries must be made electronically on the official Entry Form**

**The entry fee is £90.00 – reduced to £80 for Harrow CC and Green Belt members.**

**Payment can ONLY be made by Bank Transfer.**

**We will NOT be accepting any paper forms, cheques or cash by post before or on the day of the event. Everything MUST be done electronically in advance.**

The maximum number of entries for the event is 60+10 reserves, the minimum is 50. The maximum for each class is not set, the minimum is 4. Should any of the minimum figures not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to either cancel the event or amalgamate classes as necessary. Entries will be selected in order of date of posting.

A driver may make no more than two entries, and no more than one entry per class.

Entry fees may be refunded upon notification to the Entries Secretary of intended withdrawal not less than 7 days prior to the event, less a £5 administration fee, or should the event be cancelled for any reason whatsoever the organisers reserve the right to retain £5 of the entry fee to cover admin costs.

## **11. JUDGES OF FACT**

Judges of Fact will be appointed (G10.1) as follows:

Start Line Marshals	Unsatisfactory or false starts.
Course Marshals	Not following correct course, touching course markers or baulking.
MS UK Envir. Officer	Excessive noise/sound.

## **12. Modifications to MSA Regulations**

11.1 Regulations of the 2020 Motorsport UK Yearbook are as written except the following, which are, modified: -

S9.2.3 A driver may only be permitted a maximum of two entries and these must be in different classes. The same car may not be entered to compete for the same award more than twice, and then only provided it is driven by different drivers.

S9.3.1 Practicing and tyre warming is forbidden as there is no designated area at this venue. Anyone caught carrying out such activity may be excluded from the meeting.

S9.3.7 When a red flag is shown Q15.1(j) applies.

S9.5.1 The number of runs will be determined on the day, the fastest run to count for the results.

S9.5.4 A penalty of 5 seconds will be applied for striking a course penalty marker.

### **13. RESULTS**

Provisional results will be published as soon as possible following the end of the event. Final results will be despatched to all competitors within 14 days.

### **14. PROTESTS**

*Protest must be made in accordance with C5 and any appeals in accordance with C6.*

### **15. STARTING**

Cars will start singly. The starting signal will be a GREEN light. Timing will be automatic and activated by light beam (S9.1.6). The attention of competitors in all classes is particularly drawn to S10.9. Any vehicle not fitted with a timing strut in accordance with this regulation will not be timed. The finish line will be indicated by a FINISH board and a CHEQUERED flag.

### **16. PRACTICE and TIMED RUNS**

Competitors will have the opportunity to walk the course prior to the Drivers Briefing followed by a convoy run [*shared car drivers must do individual runs*] and two practice runs. The number of timed runs will be determined on the day.

Practice starts and tyre warming is forbidden as there is no designated area at this venue and anyone caught doing so may be excluded from the meeting as S9.3.1.

### **17. MARKING**

Marking and penalties will be as per Motorsport UK regulations except as modified below:-

Striking a course marker ..... Penalty of 5 seconds per marker  
Completing the wrong course ..... No time will be recorded  
When a RED flag is shown Q15.1(j) applies as S9.3.7(b).

### **18. IDENTIFICATION**

Competitors will be identified by numbers, which will **NOT** be provided by the organisers. Numbers should be displayed on the car such that they can be read clearly from ground level, either side of the vehicle – S9.2.5.

### **19. VENUE REQUIREMENTS – PLEASE READ THIS CAREFULLY**

Any continual revving-up or exceeding 20mph in the paddock area or entering areas of the Airfield not allocated for the event, may result in exclusion. Note: the perimeter road must be used to access the sprint area and the paddock but must be kept clear to traffic at all times – do not block the road while waiting to compete.

To enter the Airfield all vehicles will require a Vehicle Pass as supplied with the Final Instructions. All Competitors, Officials and Marshals must have one displayed on their vehicle on arrival.

**19 Spectators and Dogs are NOT allowed at this event**
